Model UN has a long and rich history at Sonoma State University. For many years we have sent a delegation to the prestigious National Model United Nations Conference in New York City, where more than 400 schools and 5000 students participate in one of the largest annual simulations of the UN, just blocks away from the real-world UN Headquarters. While in New York, we meet with the Permanent UN Mission of the country we are representing prior to the conference, which gives our students the chance to meet with real-world UN ambassadors. We also spend one day at UN Headquarters, with committees meeting in the General Assembly Hall of the UN itself. In recent years SSU has represented Nigeria, Ireland, France, Serbia, Ukraine, Iran, Venezuela, Cuba, The United States, and Denmark. The SSU Delegation has been assigned to represent <u>Argentina</u> at the 2024 NMUN Conference.

Sonoma State University's delegation has a national reputation for excellence and, since 2012, we have received numerous awards for Best Position Papers, Outstanding Delegates in Committee, Distinguished Delegation in 2023, and Outstanding Delegation (first place award) in 2019.

The course itself is a demanding, upper-division Political Science course in International Relations. All students approved for the course are expected to be active participants in the entire SSU Model UN experience: both Course and Conference. The course is open to juniors and seniors in all majors, and demand is high: there are 20 seats open for Spring 2024. All applicants are expected to have completed or be concurrently enrolled in POLS 304 'Intro to International Relations' or an equivalent upper division International Relations, Global Governance, World Regions, or Comparative Political Systems (or similar) course at SSU (or another university).

The course will meet Thursdays from 5 to 8:40 p.m. in Spring 2024. A course fee of \$500 is required. All expenses of air fare and lodging in Midtown Manhattan, New York City for the NMUN Conference April 1st through 5th will be covered by the university. Feel free to contact me with any questions.
